
To create a new tab on your Facebook fan page and post a widget, please follow these instructions:

- 1) Email support@tigerlead.com so that we can create a widget for you. We'll give you the code you'll need to post that widget on the fan page.
- 2) Log in to Facebook. You will need to have a Facebook **fan page**, not just a regular account. Fan pages are created and managed from your regular account. If you don't have a fan page, you can make one here: http://www.facebook.com/pages/create.php
- 3) You'll need to add iframe tabs to your fan page. This is done with third-party apps. You can use any suitable app, but these instructions will use the app found here:

- 4) Click the button that says "Add Static HTML to a Page". A drop-down menu will appear. Please select your fan page (in this example, the fan page is TigerLead Solutions) and click the button that says "Add Static HTML: iframes tab".






5) You will now be taken to your fan page. Click on the tab that says "Welcome" on the left sidebar.




6) Take the widget code and copy-paste it into the box labeled "Enter your content here". Now click the button that says "Save and view tab".




7) Optional: If you would like to add a second widget, go to the following link: http://www.facebook.com/add.php?api_key=128953167177144&pages Repeat steps 4-6, but this time, click the tab that says "Welcome [2]" and enter the second widget code.



8) Now it's time to rename the tabs. Click on the button that says "Edit Info" at the top of your fan page. Next, click the "Apps" button on the left sidebar. You will see a box that says "Static HTML: iframe tabs". (If you added a second tab, you will see two of these boxes.) In the box will be a link that says "Edit Settings". Click on the link and a small box will appear.




9) Type in the name you want for your tab (such as "Search All Listings" or "View My Listings") and click Save, then click Okay. If you added a second tab, repeat this for the second box.



10) You're all finished! When a lead views your fan page, it should look something like these examples. (Please note that viewing your own fan page may show you the edit options, rather than displaying the pages as they appear to other people.)
